Introduction

Middle Park Health (MPH) primarily serves the residents of Grand and Jackson counties. Middle Park Health is an independent, not-for-profit health system that is comprised of a 25-bed Critical Access Hospital, and has an integrated system of specialty services, primary care, rehab services, lab, imaging, and surgical services.

This implementation Plan accompanies the 2022 Middle Park Health CHNA. The Affordable Care Act (ACA, enacted on March 23, 2010, requires nonprofit hospitals to conduct a CHNA once every three taxable years. Middle Park Health completed it's most recent CHNA on August 12, 2022. The ACA also requires each hospital to adopt an Implementation Strategy addressing the significant health needs identified in the CHNA.

This is a three-year plan to respond to these needs.
